when volunteers are out and keep the wheels turning is like magic.





A little check-up on Meals on Wheels procedures:

- 1. Please no deliveries before 10:30. During Inspections route sheets are carefully reviewed for the times of delivery. We are held to the 10:30-1:30 time frame to ensure food stays at proper temperature.
- 2. Write on Route Sheets with ball point pens, no markers, please. Markers bleed through the paper which may obscure important information.
- 3. If note paper and gold door tags missing from the route folder please let Lottie know.
- 4. Always leave route folders in the locked box at Centerpoint when route is completed. Code to open is 4590.
